## Local 12 Musical Organizations in Review

The Sacramento Philharmonic Orchestra (SPO) just elected its Players Committee and its newly constituted Artistic Committee. There were a couple of grievances filed regarding the use of non-orchestra members and non-Local 12 members in the Nutcracker Ballet which seem to be proceeding to an amicable resolution.

The Artistic Committee consists of: **Michael Anderson**, **Eric Achen**, **Michael Meeks**, **Thomas Nugent**, and **David Robinson**. Our Union Steward is **Tom Derthick**.

The Sacramento Metropolitan Orchestra (SMO) performed a Hurricane Katrina benefit concert in October. Many of our members donated their services in order that their salary, or some of their salary, would go to the AFM's Gulf Coast Relief fund. In December SMO musi-

cians played a Messiah sing-along concert. There continue to be financial concerns with the SMO.

SMO Orchestra committee members are **Joel Elias**, **Jon Maloney**, and **Sandra McPherson**.

In the Modesto Symphony Orchestra (MSO) the conductor, Darryl One, announced that he is stepping aside at the end of this season. The Players Committee has been working toward negotiating a new contract which expires this August. To that end, Chris Durham, from AFM's Symphonic Services Division, met with the committee and Sec. Gardner to begin preparing for the negotiations. A contract survey of the musicians was recently developed and given to MSO musicians.

## Secretary's Soundboard

### Looking Backward, Looking Forward

When I began as Secretary of this Local in 2002 we were awash in debt, for the most part from trying to make our Hall earn all the money it cost us. As I recall, at one point, I

was owed approximately \$1200 to \$1500 by the Local for traveling expenses. Our Vice President and Treasurer were owed similar amounts—probably more. I recall sitting in the Modesto Symphony Orchestra negotiations with Chris Durham and the Modesto orchestra committee. Management was implying that the union would be filing many grievances. Chris emphatically told them, as only Chris can do, that this local would not be filing

frivolous grievances, that it was so poor it didn't even have a pot to p\*\*\* in.

At that point we owed more than \$15K to Lenny Liebowitz (a New York lawyer who assisted in the old Sacramento Symphony negotiations). We owed our lawyer, David Rosenfeld, perhaps \$4K. We owed the AFM-EP pension fund, we owed the AFM for a "per capita" loan. We'd stopped paying our per capita payments to our local and state labor councils. I could go on, but you get the picture. We did what we had to in order to get by.

Now we have sold our hall. We have paid most of our debts. We did hold onto two no-interest loans that we decided to pay off more slowly, so we'd have some money in the bank in case of emergency. As of this writing we owe only approximately \$2600 to the AFM for its "Per Capita" loan.

A few years ago, we re-instated with the Sacramento Labor Council. Last year we re-instated with the Fresno-Madera-Tulare-Kings Central Labor Council. And, currently we are in the process of rejoining the California Labor Federation. When I started we had 3 major collective bargaining agreements (CBA): California Musical Theatre (aka Music Circus), Fresno Philharmonic Orchestra, and Sacramento Philharmonic Orchestra. We've now added the Modesto Symphony Orchestra and the Sacramento Metropolitan Orchestra.

In 2002 we had a website which was based primarily on trying to promote the rental of the hall for banquets. Today, our website's main purpose is to promote our members (playing and teaching) and to enable our members to be connected to each other and to other professional musi-

cians. Today, if we had to, we could afford a major arbitration. I don't think that was true in 2002.

By the way, speaking of websites, we don't have ONE member or group signed up to use the free [www.gopromusic.com](http://www.gopromusic.com) referral website of the AFM. Click on Sacramento, and it says:

*Sacramento*

*There are currently no listings in this Main Category. Please choose a sub-category (above) if available.*

It's kind of embarrassing.....

What is our vision for the future? My intention would be to continue, as funds allow, to connect with all the central labor councils in our jurisdiction. I'd like to improve the visibility of our website in order to promote ourselves for more work. There are still some musical groups around that do not have the benefit of CBAs, thus not providing them with, at the very least, pension and job security. Perhaps you have ideas for what we can do as a local. I'd love to hear them. Call me or email me, before you forget!

And finally, don't forget about the musicians of New Orleans, Biloxi and other Gulf Coast communities that have had to deal with the loss and destruction of their homes, musical instruments and jobs. Even though their plight doesn't continue to be a page one story, they still need and deserve our assistance. Please join me in donating to AFM's Gulf Coast Relief Fund as stated below. Local 12 is also accepting instruments to go to the New Orleans Local's Instrument program (see page 1)

The Fresno Philharmonic finished ratifying and executing its new collective bargaining agreement this past October. Management was a little slow in getting the board ratification finished, then even slower in getting the Personal Service Agreements out.

Around the beginning of this year the musicians learned that the orchestra manager, Paul Gutierrez came down with a recurrence of cancer, this time in his lungs. Paul has since gone on disability to allow for his 18 week treatment. Shortly later, we learned that David Gaylin, the FPO Executive Director for approximately the last 2½ years, has decided to accept an offer of employment back in the Boston area, where he comes from. Needless to say, the orchestra members have been concerned about the management leadership.

As of this writing, Harlan Hutson, a former member of Local 12, has been hired to fill in for the Orchestra Manager position, and has successfully navigated his first concert set in that capacity. The FPO Board has hired Elizabeth Hare, a former Executive Director of the Chattanooga Symphony and the former Florida Philharmonic. She has some experience with the FPO, having worked on the FPO budget during the last Executive Director search.

FPO Players Committee members are **Cynthia Stuart**, chair, **Rachel Aldrich**, **Bruce Chrisp**, **Gerald Miller**, and **Laura Porter**. Our Union Steward in Fresno is **Randy Keith**.

The California Musical Theatre (aka Music Circus or CMT) Players' Committee is just gearing up to work towards a new collective bargaining agreement. The current agreement expires in a few months, at the end of June. David Schoenbrun, President of Local 6 (San Francisco) has agreed to be the lead negotiator and is being provided through AFM's Symphonic Services Division. David has a lot of experience negotiating theatre contracts-- not only in San Francisco, but also in serving on AFM's Pamphlet B theater contract negotiations.

Our CMT Players Committee consists of **Tim Acosta**, chair, **Eric Achen**, **Michael Anderson**, **Tom Derthick**, **Mike McMullen**, **Maurice Montgomery**, and **Tom Phillips**.
